SANGSTER SHIELD 2010 REPORT

Thanks to all who took part this year. Logs were received from 24 operators.

Congratulations to John ZL1ALZ in winning the Sangster Shield once again. John's 4th win of the Open Section this year equals the records of ZLs1PC & 1PZ who also gained 4 past wins.

Barry ZL2LN (Motueka) maintains his 2nd position from last year & I (ZL2KZ) am surprised to end up in 3rd place after many years out of the running.

Barry ZL2LN easily wins the Arthur Stevens South Island Trophy once more from 5 entries this year.

Wellington Branch 50 wins the Branch Award with Branch 28 2nd as the only other qualifying Branch.

There were no newly licenced entrants for the Transistor Trophy.

The 17 qualifying active Branches were: - 3,5,8,13,22,24,27,28,29,42,45,50,65,72,84,87,88.

For reasons of low activity or inaccurate copy I have deducted claims for Branches 2,19,20,44,55,56. (1 contact recorded for each)

Although two other Branch numbers were slightly low in contacts & operating time I decided to leave them in this year. The results would not have affected the order down to 7th place, there was no sign of contacts favouring any station or area & there was no good reason to take them off.

As I have stated each year, operators are encouraged to take part in the contest no matter how few contacts they can manage. We would all sooner have the extra activity rather than less. All contacts count & I have no problems in dropping the low count Branch claims for reasons of fairness.

The scoring task was a pleasure as was the opportunity for me to take part both nights this year.

Comments received:-

- Fair conditions but all stations were weaker than usual.
- Deep South was consistent in Wellington.
- A few new callsigns were about on Sunday night.
- One station began giving out sequential serial numbers rather than Branch number. (All back on track after a while & I have adjusted entries to correct the strange Branch claims. – 2KZ)
- Fairly noisy band with lightning around the mountain. (Taranaki)
- Saturday night was poor & op. took a break half way through. Sunday was better, though many seem to disappear after 2200 hrs.
- I still enjoy joining in a contest – but excuse the short log. (Of course! - 2KZ)
- Hope everyone who took part send in a log. (24 logs from my count of 26 active stations is a great outcome – 2KZ)
- Pretty quiet on Saturday and wasn't able to do all 6 hours – but enjoyable.
- With only 3 stations from the South Island, thank goodness the NI supported the competition. (5 SI stations were active counting the ZL2s in Blenheim & Motueka. – 2KZ)
- Special thanks to Gill ZL3UJZ & his 2 watter for putting Branch 05 on the air. Sad that hams from more populous areas like Wanganui, Hamilton, Rotorua, Palmerston Nth et al, don't follow his example.
