Logs: Out of the many hundreds and hundreds of AR contests that are held each year, there are only a handful that still accept paper logs. Being a very active tester I came to the conclusion a long time ago that computer software aided logging was the way of the future. I remember well having to paper and pen log 1000 plus contacts in a number of international contests, what a chore that was! Since taking on the role of NZART Contest Manager in 2010, I've always tried to encourage ZL testers and especially Memorial contest participants to ditch paper logs in favour of computer generated logs.

However it should be noted that when we talk about computer logs, that this really means plain text logs in the internationally recognised and accepted **Cabrillo** format and definitely not Word/Excel, ODT, JPG or PDF files.

Currently two contest logging software programmes support the NZART Memorial contest; and produce Cabrillo format logs: **N1MM Logger** and **VKCL**. A big thank you goes to **Mike VK3AVV** the author of VKCL who recently updated VKCL to enable his programme to generate Cabrillo format logs.

Here is a breakdown of the logs received this year: Cabrillo format logs - 20, older version VKCL logs non-Cabrillo - 9, other electronic logs - 7, and paper logs just 3. What a fantastic result! So well done everyone and especially those you who were using a computer contest logging programme for the very first time.

Why Cabrillo logs?: I well remember that for many international contests it could take almost a full year to get the results of the previous contest out before the current years contest started. Okay 30-40 or so logs in small contests such as the Memorial contest shouldn't take a year to adjudicate, but it's still takes a good amount of work and time to check logs fairly and thus make sure that the efforts of all participants is recognised in a timely manner. So just about all contests organisers/adjudicators now use computer contest log checking software to speed up the task and ensure the results are as accurate as possible. I am using the **W3KM CabEvaluator** software to check and score the logs. A very big thanks went to Dave W3KM for writing the special routines needed for the Memorial contest.
