

NZART 60m Sub Licence (2022)

Between:

The New Zealand Association of Radio Transmitters Incorporated (“NZART”)

And

Background

A NZART is the holder of a Licence number 237068 (“the Licence”) to operate on radio frequencies in the 60m band as set out in the Frequencies of Operation in Schedule A (“the 60m Band”)

B NZART is authorised to sub-license and the Amateur wishes to obtain a sub-licence to operate on the 60m Band on the conditions set out in this sub-licence (“the Sub-Licence”)

The Parties agree as follows:

Grant of Sub-Licence

1. NZART grants a non-exclusive Sub-Licence to the Amateur for the transmission of radio waves on the 60m Band for the purpose and in accordance with the terms, conditions and restrictions of this Sub-Licence including Schedule A.
2. The Sub-Licence shall commence on the Start Date and end on the Expiry Date set out in Schedule A unless earlier cancelled in accordance with this Sub-Licence.
3. The Amateur must, when using the Sub-Licence, comply with all applicable laws, and regulations, governing the transmission of radio waves in New Zealand.
4. The Amateur may not assign this Sub-Licence to any other person.
5. The Amateur acknowledges NZART will publish on its website a list of people who have been granted a Sub-Licence and agrees to his/her name and callsign(s) being included in that list.
6. NZART may vary or cancel (notwithstanding the Expiry Date in Schedule A), this Sub-Licence with immediate notice by email if:
 - a. The Licence is varied or cancelled;
 - b. The Amateur breaches any term of this Sub-Licence;

- c. The Amateur ceases to hold a General Amateur Operator’s Certificate of Competency and a callsign issued pursuant to Regulation 9 of the Radiocommunications Regulations 2001;
- d. The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (“MBIE”) directs NZART to vary or cancel the Sub-Licence.

Conditions of Use

1. For the term of this Sub-Licence the Amateur must hold a General Amateur Operator's Certificate of Competency and a callsign issued pursuant to Regulation 9 of the Radiocommunications Regulations 2001.
2. These frequencies are, or may be, allocated for use by other services. The Amateur must accept interference from, and must not cause interference to, such other services.
3. The Amateur acknowledges that recordings of their transmissions may be made and used by MBIE, a primary user of the Frequencies of Operation (if any), or NZART for the purpose of evaluating the effectiveness (or otherwise) of the 60m band and for enforcement purposes.
4. Callsigns must be transmitted at least once every 5 minutes during communications.
5. Only the Callsign set out in the Schedule above may be used. To avoid doubt special event callsigns which have been allocated to the Amateur may not be used.
6. National and international communication is permitted only between amateur stations, and is limited to matters of a personal nature, or for the purpose of self-training, intercommunication and radio technology investigation, solely with a personal aim and without pecuniary interest. The passing of brief messages of a personal nature on behalf of other persons is also permitted, provided no fees or other consideration is requested or accepted.
7. Communications must not be encoded for the purpose of obscuring their meaning, except for control signals by the operators of remotely controlled amateur stations.
8. Amateur stations must, as far as is compatible with practical considerations, comply with the latest ITU-R recommendations to the extent applicable to the amateur service.
9. Amateur beacons, repeaters and fixed links may not be established pursuant to this Sub-Licence.
10. Should interference occur to services licensed pursuant to a radio licence or a spectrum licence, NZART reserves the right to require and ensure that any transmission pursuant to this SubLicence changes frequency, reduces power, or ceases operation.
11. The power used shall not exceed the level set out in the Frequencies of Operation.
12. The maximum power is the radiated power in Watts e.i.r.p.
